of adults with a disability in England are registered as full-time employed. We are working to change that!

What is a Supported Internship?

The Shaw Trust Supported Internship is a study programme aimed at young people aged 16 to 24 who have an Education, Health and Care Plan (EHCP) and want to move into employment but need some extra support. Our internship usually lasts for a year, with the opportunity to complete three different placements.

Supported Internships give young people an opportunity to take their first steps into the world of employment, build skills in the workplace, gain qualifications, and get a paid job.

The internships offer a unique mix of education and job coaching in a range of different roles, including:



Interns can expect a programme of learning that helps them develop the skills they need for work, such as job-specific skills, employability skills and qualifications – including Functional Skills Maths and English – and broader personal and social skills.

A job coach will help source suitable jobs, arrange work trials and develop opportunities with employers.



The Supported Internship Journey



Progression into employment

Upon completion of the Supported Internship, we provide three months of transitional support to help move interns into paid employment.

Our team connect interns with local employers, and facilitate visits, trials, selection, and transitional support into employment.

We will continue to support the young person once they have moved into paid employment through the Access to Work funding. This allows us to access an 'in-work' mentor to provide support and ensure the newly employed young person makes a successful transition into paid working life.

Paid employment

Hear from our supported interns

Max

When Max joined the internship, he had very little confidence and was experiencing anxiety in everyday life, often struggling to talk to peers. Max was unsure of what he wanted to do for a career and had no previous work experience. Supported by his job coach Max undertook three placements, two based within an office and one with Transport for London. During his time working with TfL, Max developed a passion for working in the rail industry. Max was supported to apply for a role with South Western Railway. This involved application support and interview preparation. Max was successful and received a job with the company.

During the internship through Shaw Trust I gained more confidence which allowed me to enjoy meeting new people and making new friends. I learnt a lot of new skills which I will be able to use in the future. I have improved my social skills and confidence and got myself a job as a result which I'm really happy about!



Lily

Lily had an ambition to work in Early Years Education. Her first placement on the internship was at Bear Hugs Day Nursery where she worked four days a week with the team, learning the processes within the organisation. Gradually, Lily undertook additional hours to support the team, demonstrating her dedication and commitment. The managers at the nursery expressed what an asset to the team Lily was and shared that they would like to begin the process of employing Lily. Once she had completed her qualification Lily was employed as a paid Nursery Nurse with Bear Hugs Nursery.

"I feel really happy to be employed with my nursery that I love".



Will

Not only has Will gained valuable experience through the Supported Internship programme, he has also really enjoyed his work placements. Will almost didn't sign up for a place on the programme due to his quiet nature and lack of confidence. After some encouragement from his Mum he did, and he hasn't looked back since.

Through the classroom sessions and work placements Will has grown in confidence and gained valuable work and communication skills. He is chatty, friendly and loves coming to his work placement and interacting with customers. With the help of his job coach, he has overcome his fear of trying new things. Will attended placements at Beautello V, Mencap, and Five Guys. Each placement offering different work environments and skills to enhance experience and learning.

Will hopes to be able to take forward his new confidence and work skills and gain a job within the make-up industry after completing his Supported Internship.

"Everyone's been lovely, and they understand me, given me great feedback and this has boosted my confidence a lot".



Tilak

Tilak completed three placements at Thames Hospice, Five Guys and German Kebab as part of his Supported Internship. Once he completed the internship Tilak continued to receive support from his job coach and the wider team in his search for paid employment. The team supported him with interview practice and offered valuable moral support throughout the whole process. With the team's help Tilak secured paid employment with Heathrow Duty Free and was awarded Employee of the month within his first 5 months.

Tilak gained work skills and the ability and confidence to be himself. He has set himself personal goals to help progress in his job, which will allow him to become more independent in the future.

"The internship was key for me to get a paid job, I went to so many interviews which were unsuccessful, but the staff helped me overcome my fears and stress. They were always understanding, kind and patient".




Find out if we offer a Supported Internship near you
